4. Where did you learn your views on stewardship?
5. Do you have the same views on stewardship as your parents? If not, why not?

  - a. If you attend church, how often do you hear stewardship preached about?  
Is it preached about enough?
  - b. If you do not attend church, where do you hear about stewardship most often?
7. What area of stewardship would you like to do better at or be more consistent in?
